LOCAL FILM FESTIVAL WORKS TOWARD ZERO WASTE GOALS WITH HELP FROM INNOVATIVE RECYCLING SOLUTION

Cleveland International Film Festival Reinforces Commitment to Sustainability with TerraCycle's Zero Waste Boxes Program

CLEVELAND, Ohio. (March 2, 2020) - The Cleveland International Film Festival (CIFF) has partnered with international recycling leader TerraCycle[®] to minimize their plastic footprint. Through the Zero Waste Boxes program, CIFF employees and festival attendees can work together to offset the amount of plastic waste being sent to landfills or ending up in oceans.

The 44th CIFF will be held March 25th-April 5th and CIFF will set up zero waste stations around the festival in areas accessible to guests, staff and volunteers. Each station will have a Plastic Packaging Zero Waste Box and separate bins for compost, recycling, and mixed paper.

CIFF's sustainability efforts are led by the Green Team, a group of staff and volunteers who manage waste collection during the festival, weigh and report the outcomes, and educate staff, volunteers, and patrons about the importance of zero waste efforts. At last year's event, the Green Team helped collect 204.4 lbs of plastic waste through Zero Waste Boxes, and 9,192.5 lbs of total waste.

In Cuyahoga County, the only types of plastics eligible for curbside recycling are plastic bottles and jugs. The Plastic Packaging Zero Waste Box makes it easy and convenient for the CIFF team to recycle all other kinds of plastic waste, from food containers to packing peanuts.

"Implementing TerraCycle into our routine at our offices and at our festival has definitely made a difference," says Grace Sullivan, Green Team Manager at CIFF. "Not only are we preventing plastic of all sorts from ending up in landfills or the ocean, but we are spreading awareness to everyone who attends our festival."

Like most plastic packaging, the conventionally unrecyclable waste collected at the festival would have otherwise been landfilled, incinerated, or may have even contributed to the pollution of marine habitats. The collected packaging will now be recycled into a variety of new products such as park benches, bike racks, shipping pallets and recycling bins.

TerraCycle, the world's leader in the collection and repurposing of complex waste streams, created the Zero Waste Box program to provide solutions for difficult-to-recycle waste that cannot be recycled through TerraCycle's brand-sponsored, national recycling programs or via standard municipal recycling.

CIFF hopes the implementation of TerraCycle's Zero Waste Boxes at the festival will help spread awareness about sustainability and zero waste efforts to all attendees.

"Through our sustainability initiatives, we have learned so much about all the ways we can make a difference," says Sullivan. "Once you start making the effort, you realize how many people around you want to make a difference, but don't know where to start. It's nice to be able to spread the message through your own actions, and to help others to do the same."
