**LEMON STREET MARKET INTRODUCES NEW INITIATIVE TO
REDUCE ITS CARBON FOOTPRINT**

*Local Grocery Reinforces Commitment to Sustainability with Help of Zero Waste Boxes from
TerraCycle®*

LANCASTER, PA, June 6, 2022 - Lemon Street Market, a local, organic, vegan, and gluten-free grocer, has teamed up with TerraCycle to divert their hard-to-recycle waste from landfills through the Zero Waste Box program.

Independent and woman-owned, Lemon Street Market strives to provide healthy, all-natural groceries and meals to those in and around Lancaster. The local grocer also goes the extra mile by providing customers with the proper tools needed to divert waste from landfills through recycling, composting, reduction, or reuse. As part of its commitment to the environment, Lemon Street Market's partnership with TerraCycle is a testament to the company's focus on sustainability and its daily efforts to minimize its environmental impact.

The market's produce team receives shipments of fresh greens in large plastic clamshell packaging. With no free local opportunities to recycle these clamshells, Lemon Street Market now stations TerraCycle's Plastic Packaging Zero Waste Boxes at the receiving dock, where clamshells are processed and collected, for easy recycling. This conventionally unrecyclable waste would otherwise be landfilled, incinerated, or contribute to the pollution of marine habitats. Using TerraCycle, the collected waste can now be recycled into a variety of new products such as park benches, bike racks, shipping pallets, and recycling bins.

TerraCycle, the world's leader in the collection and repurposing of complex waste streams, created the Zero Waste Box program to provide solutions for difficult-to-recycle waste that cannot be recycled through TerraCycle's brand-sponsored, national recycling programs or via standard municipal recycling. Lemon Street Market decided to utilize boxes that would address hard-to-recycle waste produced in their grocery store.

"Seeing the amount of seemingly insignificant plastic clamshells we were collecting really opened my eyes to the amount of waste produced within the grocery industry. In just about 3 months, we collected about 100 lbs of plastic packaging to be diverted from landfills," said Olivia Schmids, Sustainability Director at Lemon Street Market. "I am immensely proud of my team at Lemon Street Market for raising the bar when it comes to sustainability in business."
